[Introductions and Opening Comments - Charlie Gabriel](#)

Charlie Gabriel opened the meeting and thanked everyone for attending. These sessions will be scheduled after the monthly Project Status Meetings. Asked team leads for a draft transition plan for Police, Fire, and EMS.

Agency Transition High Level Discussion Topics - Jan Blair

Jan Blair said he appreciates everyone for joining this meeting. He distributed an agenda, which will deal with Agency transition discussion topics for Motorola and the Agency Team Leads. Talked about legacy channels to be patched in with Motorola system. Will have more at next meeting.

Other questions, comments, or area of concern –

Bill Bleye – representing the County Police Chiefs-stated that they discussed and approved Syracuse Police being the first to use the system. They would be able to revert to the legacy equipment due to currently using UHF. State police could be next since they are not getting rid of legacy and would be able to revert.

Field users could use portables until United Radio were able to install mobiles in vehicles.

Bill asked United Radio what a typical install would be.

United Radio handed out a matrix for what is billable at the last meeting. They will send it out again to team leads as a final draft.

Joe Rinefierd – Director, Fire Bureau – Spoke about Syracuse Fire Department will be first for fire departments to start on the new system. Training on new system will have to go hand-in-hand with handing out the portable radios.

Joe asked United Radio what the period would be to swap out a mobile in a vehicle.

United Radio replied a standard install (top of dash mount with bracket) would probably take about 3 hours per vehicle.

Transition will probably start in east of the city and work its way around the county.

Joe asked what channels and how long will the legacy channels would be cross band to the Motorola system?

Brian Butler – United Radio – Will be sending out a pricing Matrix along with questioner regarding mobile location and accessories attached to mobile.
